CITY ORDINANCE NO. 07-2018

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A UNIFORM COLOR FOR ALL PUBLIC ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOL BUILDINGS IN TUGUEGARAO CITY

WHEREAS, it has been observed that public elementary and high school buildings and establishments within Tuguegarao City are all painted with colors that differ from one another;

WHEREAS, there is a need to adopt a uniform color for these public schools so they can be readily identified as a color within the territorial jurisdiction of Tuguegarao City, especially for those located near the boundaries;

WHEREAS, the adoption of a uniform color will also prevent and deter the use of the school colors as a means of political or election campaigning, which is likewise a pernicious practice observed from public officers, whether elected or appointed. It will likewise deter the promotion of partisan politics, where the incumbent public officer usually adopts the colors of his or her own political party in projects and establishments owned by the City Government.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it **ORDAINED** BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF TUGUEGARAO CITY:

SECTION 1. TITLE – This Ordinance shall be known as “*UNIFORM COLOR FOR SCHOOL BUILDINGS ORDINANCE.*”

SECTION 2. DEFINITION OF TERMS. When used in this Ordinance, the following terms shall mean:

1. Color Scheme – it is the choice of colors used to design and to create style and appeal
2. Territorial jurisdiction – refers to jurisdiction over cases arising within a defined territory
3. Pernicious practice – it is an unlawful practice employed by government officers especially in terms of politics
4. Deter – is defined as to discourage someone from doing or instilling doubt or fear of the consequences

SECTION 3. USE OF UNIFORM COLOR – Upon the effectivity of this Ordinance, all public elementary and secondary school buildings within the jurisdiction of Tuguegarao City, including those which are newly established and about to be established, shall adopt/or use only the prescribed uniform color stated herein, provided that for existing school buildings, the adoption of the said required colors shall be only done upon the repainting of the same in accordance with this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. ADOPTION OF UNIFORM COLOR – The City Mayor of Tuguegarao City is hereby given the power to adopt the standard color scheme provided by the Department of Education as the color applied to all public elementary and secondary school buildings in Tuguegarao City.

- A. Uniform Color Designation – The prescribed colors for all public elementary and secondary schools within the jurisdiction of Tuguegarao City shall be as follows:
1. Copper Bright (reddish brown) for the border accent;
 2. Pure Ivory (white) for the body;
 3. Kitten White (variation of white) for the body accent and ceiling;
 4. Bright Silver nano-finish cladding for inverted “U” and canopy, or Gray Tropics in case of concrete;
 5. Day Star (orange yellows, yellows and green yellows) for the body accents;
 6. Indian Corn (red, blue, orange/multicolored) for the parapets and columns;
 7. Red for steel doors and window grills; and,
 8. The color of the roof shall be in accordance with the Department of Education/City Schools Division Office of Tuguegarao City standards.

SECTION 5. PERIOD FOR REPAINTING – All public elementary and secondary school buildings and establishments within Tuguegarao City should be repainted not more than once every three (3) to five (5) years. This provision does not apply to repainting needed as a result of a normal wear and tear, or when the paint of the said schools has already faded, at the discretion of public school directors.

SECTION 6. IMPLEMENTATION – The provisions of this Ordinance shall be adopted by all elementary and secondary public schools within the jurisdiction of Tuguegarao City upon the passage of this ordinance on the scheduled repainting of existing elementary and secondary public schools as well as the painting of newly-established or about to be established elementary and secondary public schools.

SECTION 7. APPROPRIATION – The amount needed to carry out the initial implementation of this Ordinance shall be taken from the available funds of the City Government allotted for every public school.

SECTION 8. IMPLEMENTING OFFICE – The Office of the City Mayor through the different public school heads is mandated to implement the provisions of this Ordinance.


SECTION 9. REPEALING CLAUSE – All ordinances, resolutions local executive orders, rules and regulations or any part thereof which are inconsistent with any of the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed, modified or amended accordingly.

SECTION 10. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE – If any of the provisions of this ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid by a competent court, the other provisions hereof shall continue to be in full force and effect.


SECTION 11. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE – This ordinance shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication.
